

- ❖ Stories of battles and conquests
- ❖ Intergenerational association with the land
- ❖ Archaeology can provide physical evidence
- ❖ Supports traditional stories



Relationship with Pukehāngi

Ngāti Kearoa Ngāti Tuara

- ❖ Lived here for hundreds of years
- ❖ Significant sites at Pukehāngi and Tihi-o-Tonga
 - Pukehāngi and Puketapu pā
 - Paparata kāinga
 - Cultivations
 - Karamu- Takina and Mawae Springs
 - Utuhina to Tarewa

Impact of Plan Change 2 - Pukehāngi

- ❖ Cultural sites
- ❖ Te Mana o te Wai
 - Stormwater management
 - Water quality
 - Sewerage management
- ❖ Housing
- ❖ Related issues
 - Karamu Takina water supply
 - Pukehāngi Pā

Cultural Sites

Ngāti Kearoa Ngāti Tuara sought:

- ❖ Consultation on issues re cultural heritage of area
- ❖ Ensure sites are recognized and protected
- ❖ Establish historical structures telling stories
- ❖ Consultation on names of streets, reserves, etc
- ❖ Name a public recreation reserve
- ❖ Consultation on downstream cultural sites

Stormwater management

- ❖ 700-900 extra houses will lead to more run-off, wastewater, etc
- ❖ Concerns about how this will be managed
- ❖ Ngāti Kearoa Ngāti Tuara sought:
 - A guarantee that there is a significant decrease in downstream flooding in areas like our kāinga at Tarewa



Housing

- ❖ The main objective of Plan Change 2 is to increase housing
- ❖ Council responsibility to provide affordable housing

Ngāti Kearoa Ngāti Tuara sought:

- ❖ Developers be required to provide for affordable housing

Related issues – Karamu Takina Spring

- ❖ Outstanding grievance for hapū
- ❖ Agreement with Council to be finalized within 6 months



Related issues – Pukehāngi Pā

- ❖ Ancestral pā to which we don't have access
- ❖ Consultation on Parkland development
 - Initial agreements reached: fencing, signage, etc
 - Gated community developed later
 - No further consultation and no access
 - Example of poor planning process and limited consultation

Ngāti Kearoa Ngāti Tuara sought:

- ❖ Council to resolve this issue
- ❖ To be notified and acknowledged as an affected party in Pukehāngi development



Consultation and Resourcing

- ❖ Ngāti Kearoa Ngāti Tuara engaged to prepare CIA (only iwi invited)
- ❖ Involved in process for over 2 years
- ❖ Waitangi Tribunal has commented that the lack of resources profoundly affects Māori participation in the RMA processes

Ngāti Kearoa Ngāti Tuara sought:

- ❖ To be notified and acknowledged as an affected party on cultural sites, downstream water quantity and water quality
- ❖ Adequate levels of funding
