Ngongotahā Flood Review Project

A Year in Review 2020

Tēnā koutou katoa

It has been two years since the independent review panel released its report in relation to the Ngongotahā Flood Event of 29 April 2018. This report summarises the work carried out in 2020 in relation to Ngongotahā Flood Review Action Plan.

Significant progress has been made this year, in particular:

- Shortlisting of potential flood mitigation options.
- Continued removal of problematic trees from the upper catchment down to the Brookdale Drive area.
- Construction of detainment bunds in the upper catchment.
- Completion of the Paradise Valley Community Response Plan.

Most significantly, \$3.7 million of central government funding was secured to progress the detainment bunds, tree removal and engineering options.

Cluster 1: Roles and Responsibilities

ACTIONS 1-4

Work progressed or completed in 2020:

- Only 2 Community Reference Group meetings held in 2020 due to covid-19 restrictions.
- Planning Community Information Session (29 August) cancelled due to covid-19 restrictions.
- Project was part of a wider multi-project community information evening in September.
- Use of Ngongotahā news, Weekender and project e-pānui & webpage to disseminate information.

Cluster 2: Stream repairs and maintenance

ACTIONS 5-7

Work progressed or completed in 2020:

- Stream repairs and maintenance carried out throughout the year.
- Tree removal programme accelerated due to central government funding.
- Stream maintenance plan completed.

Focus for 2021: Continued tree removal as well as stream repairs and maintenance

Cluster 3: Engineering, modelling and options

ACTIONS 8-9

Work progressed or completed in 2020:

- Flood mitigation options shortlisted from 12 options to a combination of six options.
- Downstream of SH5, this will include raising a small portion of western road, stop banks, overland flow paths and enhancing existing high flow bypasses. Modelling continues to confirm the extent of each intervention.
- The upper catchment options including detainment bunds and exploring land use change.

Focus for 2021: Completed modelling. Landowner engagement followed by wider community engagement for proposed mix of flood mitigation options downstream of SH5. Commencement of works, where resource consent is not required.

Cluster 4: Civil defence and readiness

ACTIONS 10-12

Work progressed or completed in 2020:

- Community response plan completed for the Paradise Valley Community.
- Other actions completed in 2019 (e.g. Emergency Management Plan) or are ongoing.

Focus for 2021: Commence Community Response Plan for the Ngongotahā Community.



Cluster 5: RMA Planning and Consents

ACTIONS 13-18

Work progressed or completed in 2020:

- Plan scoping and technical assessments to inform the District Plan review are underway.
- Other actions completed in 2019 (13-15) or are reliant on the completion of other actions (17-18)

Focus for 2021: Complete District Plan Review.

Cluster 6 Upper Catchment considerations

ACTIONS 6, 10 AND 19

Work progressed or completed in 2020:

- Tree removal & detainment bund programme accelerated due to central government funding.
- 11 detainment bunds to be constructed by Christmas (example in below right photo).
- Community response plan completed for the Paradise Valley Community.

Focus for 2021: Continued tree removal. Construction of additional detainment bunds.
